

It's a new year and a great time to be a panther! We concluded our snow Week activities the Week of January 9-13. I thought it would be terrible, but the money was good so I agreed. It turned out to be a blessing. I got to see the sunrise every morning and was the first and last face the kids saw each day. Yes, the kids can be a little rambunctious from time to time, but stopping the bus and asking them to sit down or calling parents usually took care of any issues. Being a bus driver is a very important job. If this is something you are even remotely interested in doing, please come talk to me in the office. I would love to alleviate any concerns you might have or have you ride along on a route to see that it can actually be pretty fun.







The art room will be full of new concepts from K-12 here in the new semester. I look forward to seeing what their minds will create with the criteria set for each class. Each class has an opportunity to enter their art in the all school fair at the end of the year.
